MEMORIAL DAY

The Spring City Mayor and Council will designate those to post signs stating how long items may be left on cemetery spaces. Items left on cemetery lots or burial spaces after the grace period is over will be discarded.

CUT FLOWERS AND POTTED PLANTS

Cut flowers and potted plants, wreaths and blankets shall not be allowed on grave lawns longer than three days, except during the period from December 1 to March 1, and for one week following Memorial Day, unless removed by the owner within the above times, the City staff or contracted lawn care professionals shall remove all items. Owners shall be responsible for their own vases and containers. Flowers, plants, or wreaths may be left indefinitely on lots or burial spaces if placed upon a permanent and substantial foundation or base which shall be a part of the monument/headstone.

DECORATION OF GRAVE SPACES

Flowers, wreaths etc. may be left on cemetery spaces indefinitely if they are:

- 1. The flowers are placed in vases that are a permanent part of the monument/monument/headstone;
- 2. Wreaths or swags attached to the monument/monument/headstone with wire or string;
- 3. Any items that are placed upon the concrete pad of the monument/ headstone.

MEMORIAL TREES AND SHRUBS

The planting of trees and shrubs on occupied or unoccupied grave spaces, as well as perennial plants, is prohibited. All trees and shrubs must be planted with the approval of the Mayor and City Council. If donations are made the City shall take donations for plant material and shall purchase, at cost, trees and shrubs according to donors wishes in the Spring of each year. The plant material shall be planted by the City at no cost to the donor. If the lot or burial space owner wishes to plant their own trees and shrubs or to have a business plant a tree or shrub, written permission with a spotted location within the Cemetery must be obtained before planting.
