If you want to be a candidate for city office, the time to declare is between June 2 and June 6 (ending at 5 pm). In Spring City this year, voters will be electing two council members to serve for terms of four years, one council member to serve for a term of two years. and a new mayor.

Now is your opportunity to get involved with city govern- Before declaring your candidacy, check the requirements to confirm you qualify. You must be registered to vote in Spring City and have been a resident of the city (or of land annexed into the city) for a period of 12 months. Candidates cannot have been convicted of a disqualifying felony or election offense.

> Participate in the process to ensure that Spring City is well prepared to face the future. Check with the City Recorder, RuthAnn McCain, if you have any questions. Election information can also be found on the Spring City website, under Elections.
