We expect more than 100 artists to attend, including many who will be visiting for the first time. I hope our residents will join me in welcoming them to our community, and I encourage everyone to participate in the events taking place throughout the weekend.

Planning & Zoning News by Sally Scott

The Planning & Zoning Commission met on 26 August. The minutes of 22 July were approved with one amendment added. 2 subdivisions were approved; the Philip Wood initiated subdivision encompassing his duplexes on 700 East, and the Kenneth Krogue initiated subdivision on 600 South to split his building lot. Road signage recommendations for some of the streets of Spring

City were discussed and there will be a report given by the Road Signage Committee next month.

A discussion was held on the General Plan for the city. Three engineering companies have submitted plans to Spring City, one of which will be chosen to write or help write our newest General Plan.

As council liaison to Planning & Zoning, Michael Broadbent gave a short report to commission on council activities. Zoning Administrator Craig Paulsen reported regarding issues he had dealt with during the course of the month. Several zoning permits were approved including one for a new

home, and a buffer zone application for a home in the county was completed and submitted to Sanpete County. A survey for Wetlands has been given to Spring City to complete and will need to be discussed and completed by Council. Many thanks to all who joined us and contributed to our meeting.

Black Canyon Fire Update 9/01/2026

As of the time of this writing the Black Canyon Fire is at 3,264 acres burned and 95 percent containment. Spring City Canyon Road is now open, as is Skyline Drive (according to Google AI). The tent camp at Spring City Square the was used for housing the firefighters, and the catering and sanitary facilities have been removed. The wet weather has been helpful in extinguishing and containing the fire.
